From the Rector's Desk . . .

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday which falls on February 14th this year. Lent is a time for self-examination and reflection; a time of repentance. I share some thoughts and suggestions from Frank T. Griswold's book "Praying our Days: A Guide and Companion".

He offers questions for reflection such as:

How central to my life is my desire to discern and fulfill God's loving purpose for me?

Am I open to becoming ever more the person God created me to be? Have I betrayed the dignity I have been given as a child of God? How have I used and misused the gifts and talents God has given me? How have I responded to the opportunities for witness and service that have been set before me?

Have I given witness to God's love in my relationships? Am I ready to receive God's mercy and forgiveness?

And a Meditation on God's Compassion:

As we examine ourselves we may have to confront our resistance to God's compassion, and our tendency to cling instead to the dark comfort of our self-judgment. The interior struggle between Christ's insistent love and our resistance is described by George Herbert in his poem entitled "Love." Love in the poem is the person of the risen Christ. The "meat" he offers is his reconciling and healing love, which comes to us in many forms including the Bread and Wine of the eucharist.

Ash Wednesday

The Ash Wednesday liturgy, with the imposition of ashes, will occur on February 14th at Noon (no music) and at 7 p.m. with Music in the Sanctuary. This is a moving liturgy and sets the tone for the church season and spirituality of Lent. Lent is a time of repentance - a word which means "to return". It is a yearly reminder of the daily call to come home to God.

Lenten Offering of Lectio Divina

On Thursdays at 11 a.m. during the season of Lent (Beginning February 22 and then March 1, March 8, March 15, and March 22), Meg Devereux will guide us in the prayer practice of Lectio Divina.

"Lectio Divina is one of the great treasures of the Christian tradition of prayer. It means Divine Reading, which is reading the book we believe to be divinely inspired. This tradition of prayer flows out of a Hebrew method of studying the Scriptures which was called *haggadah*. *Haggadah* was an interactive interpretation of the Scriptures by means of the free use of the text to explore its inner meaning. It was part of the devotional practice of the Jews in the days of Jesus."

This is a time to rest in God and listen for how God speaks to you. Meg will be utilizing the upcoming Sunday's lectionary readings for our Lectio Divina. Join us! Feel free to stay for our Noonday Eucharist with healing afterwards.

Gentle Yoga at Trinity

Nancy Murphy continues to lead us well in gentle yoga at Trinity! Join us on the second and fourth Thursday of the month – February 8th and February 22nd – at 12:40 p.m. (after the noon service). No prior yoga experience is necessary. Mats available, simply wear comfortable clothing (easy to move around in). Free will offering.

Our pastoral care team will hold its regular meeting on the Third Thursday, February 15th at 12:30 pm (after the noon service).

Vestry Meeting

Vestry will meet on Sunday, February 18th at 11:15 a.m. in the upstairs Sunday School room for its regular third Sunday meeting.

Stations of the Cross / Compline

Each year we offer devotions to observe the Stations of the Cross along with Compline on Fridays at 7:00 PM during Lent. This year we will begin on Friday, February 23rd.

The Way of the Cross imitates the practice of visiting the places of Jesus' Passion in the Holy Land by early Christian pilgrims. The service consists of opening devotions and the Lord's Prayer followed by a short verse and response, a reading, a prayer and a collect at each of the fourteen stations. Concluding prayers before the altar follow the fourteenth station.

The service ends with the reading of Compline. This brief service includes the opening sentences, confession of sins, psalms and other Bible lessons, canticles and prayers, including a benediction. Compline makes a nice closing to the work week. Please join us for a rewarding thirty minutes.
