From the Rector's Desk . . .

It's exciting around Trinity Church these days!

We have property upgrades occurring: the restrooms are finally being redone, the fire escape will be repaired and the upstairs will then be reclaimed for Sunday School and a Nursery with new paint, flooring and a licensed care provider. We have an 150th anniversary to plan and look forward to because back in 1859 members of this Coatesville community saw a need for an Episcopal parish. They met in a school house at Third and Main Street (southwest corner) and in private homes until the parish was organized. "The parish was organized in June, 1868 by some sixty (60) communicants and Coatesville, with a population of about 2,000 had just been incorporated as a Borough (1867) and the Coatesville School District established as a unit.

Sunday, October 4, 1868, the first service of the Coatesville parish of the Protestant Episcopal Church was conducted by our first Rector, The Rev. George G. Field." We will continue to work toward raising the funds for a new organ and the renovations needed in our sanctuary, etc. in anticipation of being a place of abundant hospitality now and in 2018 for our grand celebration year and for years to come. I am grateful to be in a community such as Trinity, where we are a warm and caring church community that also lives into God's calling to be part of our wider Coatesville community. With that in mind, the Vestry and Rector are looking forward to working with a sultant to assist us in creating a living, breathing long-range plan for our future together. This plan will include our 150th anniversary celebration. These are indeed exciting times in the life of Trinity Church. Hold on to your hats and enjoy the journey! Prayers of gratitude for those "some sixty communicants" that made the exciting decision to organize as a church family.

Save the Date: "Thresholds" training Saturday, March 19

"Thresholds" is an educational program taught by trained volunteers to inmates at Chester County Prison, and there will be a one –day training session held on this date. More info will be printed in March Trinity Topics

I want to highly recommend this volunteer opportunity to you; it's some of the most satisfying work I've ever done as a volunteer. Volunteers and inmates get together one-on-one for an hour once a week for six weeks; additionally the inmates have a classroom session once a week with an experienced volunteer. The curriculum uses a variety of methods to teach, step by step, better decision making than the thinking that landed the inmates in prison (which in many cases was a non-thinking reaction to a situation).

Inmates are selected for the program based on their expressing interest and on an interview with a program coordinator. Safety has never seemed to me to be a problem; the meetings with individual inmates are always under the eyes of corrections officers.

The benefit for you is a ministry that is not officially "Ministry." Chapel and religious visitation are controlled by the prison chaplain; this is different. Inmates are immensely grateful for the opportunity to talk to someone who is not part of the prison or judicial system and is willing to be non-judgmental. You will have a chance to make a difference to a man or woman who has a pretty good chance of benefiting from your help.

THE HEALING MINISTRY

When I first arrived at the Church of the Trinity here in Coatesville, I felt as if I had arrived at a new home. I had recently left my home church of over 70 years to move to Pennsylvania to live with my daughter and son-in-law; one of the hardest parts of the move was leaving Christ Church in Herkimer, NY but I immediately knew that I had found the right place for me to worship.

After a few weeks I was asked to join the choir... I had sung in our church choir at Herkimer since I was a child. Soon Pastor Sherry came to visit me in my new home, and one of her first questions was "what ministry would you like to be involved in?" That startled me a bit because I had just completed the first course of study for the Order of St. Luke, the Physician, which prepares people to be involved in a healing ministry that included the "Laying on of hands and prayer" by lay ministers in the church (meaning they were not ordained ministers). I had not even had a chance to practice this ministry before I moved down here, yet to my own amazement, I responded to Sherry's question with "I would like to be in the healing ministry." I know now that the Holy Spirit gave me that answer... and there was no way to back out of it! We decided that the 3rd Sunday of each month would be the best time to have folks come for this new ministry. So... with much doubt and trepidation, I started laying hands on people and praying for healing in mind, body and spirit for each one that came to me. It has been an amazing journey for the past ten years. The rewards are tremendous, not just for the individuals that I pray for, but for me as well. I often feel such a connection with those who come. It has been the most rewarding ministry I have ever been involved in. I had been on the Vestry in my home church and had been very active in Sunday School as a teacher and especially when my own three children were growing up. But this ministry far exceeds anything I had done previously, because it is led by the Holy Spirit; He directs my prayers and He is the Healer (not me!).

For men: 105 pairs of socks (!), 7 pairs of shoes/boots, 23 shirts, 3 pair of pants, 5 sweatshirts, 4 sweaters, 5 hats, 2 coats, and a lot of brand new underwear

For women and children: 13 coats, 35 sweaters and sweatshirts, 5 pairs of boots, 4 pair of gloves, and 5 hats
