#### From the Rector's Desk . . .

I have been thinking about coincidences lately and am continually reminded how there seem to be no coincidences. When "serendipity" happens, it is a marvel to behold and I give thanks to our creator God. Serendipity's definition is: a "fortunate happenstance" or "pleasant surprise". It was coined by Horace Walpole in 1754. In a letter he wrote to a friend, Walpole explained an unexpected discovery he had made by reference to a Persian fairy tale, The Three Princes of Serendip. The princes, he told his correspondent, were "always making discoveries, by accidents and sagacity, of things which they were not in quest of".

I also refer to these instances as "God incidences" or "a God thing". So this month I share a story from the book **Small Miracles: Extraordinary Coincidences from Everyday Life** by Yitta Halberstam & Judith Leventhal:

Rabbi Abraham Leifer of Ashdod, Israel, who died several years ago, was a celebrated rabbi with many followers. When one of his faithful flock married off a child in Antwerp, Belgium, Rabbi Leifer took an entourage from Israel with him and flew to the wedding. They were nine men in all.

When they were only three hundred miles away from Antwerp, the pilot suddenly announced that the plane was low on fuel and they would have to make an unscheduled stop. They landed at a small country airport.

Everyone deplaned, and the rabbi and his followers decided to look for a solitary spot where they could conduct the evening prayer service. The rabbi approached an airport worker, and asked him if it would be possible to open up a room where they could pray privately. The request was couched in ordinary terms, in English, but the man blanched as if he had been punched. He stared at the rabbi in disbelief and then answered, "I'll grant your wish... provided that you allow me to chant the kaddish (the Jewish memorial prayer for the dead) for my father!"

"You are a Jew?" the rabbi asked in bewilderment. The man nodded yes. "I didn't know any Jews lived in this part of Belgium. What are you doing here?" The man rejoined, "Better yet... what are you doing here... today of all days, just when I need you?"

As the man opened the door of the private room the rabbi had requested, he said: "Let me tell you something, which you may find difficult to believe. But I promise it is true."

"I broke with my family years ago and fled to this small village. Although I originally come from an extremely Orthodox family, I myself have not been religious for decades. I have not said kaddish for my father in years.

"Last night, I had a dream in which my father came to me and said: 'Yankele, tomorrow is the anniversary of my death and I want you to say the kaddish for me!' 'But father,' I protested in the dream, 'you need a minyan (a quorum of ten men) in order to say kaddish. I'm the only Jew in this village. I can never hope to find a minyan here!' 'Yankele,' my father answered, 'if you promise me you'll say the kaddish, I promise you I'll bring you a minyan!'

"When I awoke from the dream," the man told my uncle, I was trembling and in shock. But I soon told myself it was only a dream, and reassured myself that it had no significance. It was ridiculous, really! After all, how would a minyan ever find their way to a remote Belgian farming village where no other Jews reside?"

The rabbi draped his arm around the man's shoulders, and said gently, "Come my friend, let's pray!"

## St. Cyril's Day Celebration June 26th

Our annual St. Cyril's Day celebration will be held on Sunday, June 26<sup>th</sup>. We have the Concordia Choir joining us for a concert open to all to help us celebrate that day. They come to us through the

efforts of our organist and choirmaster Gail Busch. Some background on Concordia from their website: Concordia Choral Arts (CCA) is a non-profit choral organization dedicated to providing an environment that culturally enriches the community through exposure to the performing arts. CCA's choirs rehearse continually and perform 3 concert series every year along with outreach performances and hired gigs.

Founded in the Fall of 2006, CCA choirs have reached out to the community in a variety of ways including performances of the National Anthem at professional sporting events, the West Chester Old Fashioned Christmas, Uptown! Entertainment Alliance's Christmas plays, Longwood Gardens Christmas celebrations, West Chester's 'First Friday' events, and numerous senior living facilities. In July of 2012 we hosted and performed with The Voices of Namibia (an award-winning choir from Africa on tour in the United States), and in July of 2013 we hosted the Nairobi Chamber Choir from Kenya.

We were recently selected to perform at the American Choral Directors' Association – Pennsylvania Chapter's conference, one of only six choirs selected from state-wide submissions to represent the best in choral music across Pennsylvania.

We had 24 volunteers working side-by-side; six+ setting-up in stone hall and the rest in the kitchen, prepping and cooking, along with laughing and sharing.

Our theme this month was a combination of Mexican and Italian. Chef Kevin did a masterful job applying his skills and directions for a smooth running operation. Menu items were: scrambled eggs, bacon, French toast, Swiss-sausage casserole, chicken enchiladas, meatballs & sauce, Mexican rice, taco corn bread casserole, mac-n-cheese, roasted potatoes with peppers and onions, corn & tomato salad with cilantro; homemade cole slaw; potato salad, and a donation from Ross, a dedicated friend and veteran, who made some excellent homemade, salsa, refried beans, guacamole and sopaipilla (a Spanish dessert). "But we also need a suitable home for this new organ, and our present surroundings are in need of attention and repair. This will require funding, as well. Can we address both of these areas in a common initiative?"

#### "Spring Cleaning" Collection for Coatesville Shelters

Let's do it again! As we did last year, let's bring to church cleaning products and other household needs for the three shelters in Coatesville: Atkinson Shelter and City Gate Shelter for homeless men, and CYWA Shelter for homeless women and their children. We'll collect through June. These are the needs I heard about when I spoke to staff members:

Liquid dishwashing detergent for hand-washing pots and pans

Laundry detergent, liquid or pods, any size except the huge jugs of liquid Pinesol, bleach

Toilet bowl cleaner

Disinfecting wipes

Toilet paper, paper towels and paper napkins

Disposable plates (but please, not the thin type which gets soggy)

Disposable silverware

Disposable cups for cold drinks

Plastic trash bags, 30 gallon or 39 gallon size

There will be boxes placed at the back of the church, or just leave your shopping bags there, and we'll deliver. **Thank you on behalf of the shelters!** 

#### Lunch-making for Good Works Rehab Volunteers Sat. 5/14

Good Works is a Coatesville-based Christian housing rehab ministry begun in 1988. It offers home improvement assistance to low-income homeowners who are financially unable to afford the work needed. The goal of the ministry is simply to make homes "warmer, safer and drier." Those receiving assistance must own their own homes and have lived in them for two years, with property taxes paid. They are screened and credit-checked. Most of the homeowners who receive the assistance are elderly, single parents, or individuals with physical disabilities. Those who have received help live primarily in Coatesville and West Chester, with some additionally in Honey Brook, Phoenixville, and Parkesburg. If you'd like to know more about this ministry, the web address is www.goodworksinc.org

In 2015 1,777 volunteers performed 40,447 hours of work on homes (and made lunches!), and 172 families/homeowners were helped! And the work on 44 homes was finished in 2015.

So on **Saturday, May 14**, members of Episcopal Church of the Trinity (remember: small but mighty!) will be gathering in the church kitchen to prepare lunch for approximately 60 crew leaders, volunteers, homeowners and homeowner families at probably 5 work sites in the vicinity of

Coatesville. Actual counts of people and work sites will be phoned to me that morning.

We'll need sandwich slapper-togethers, apple-washers, banana bunch-breakers, cup and plate counters, boxer-uppers, and then as many as five drivers to deliver our fine lunches to work sites.

Lunches should be delivered by 11:30 am. I suggest we start at 9:00 am since we haven't tried this before.

Work might include buying food and supplies (save your receipt and you will be reimbursed), preparing lunches, or driving and delivering.
