From the Rector's Desk . .

We look to a new, fresh year ahead of us, giving thanks for all that has been and all that will be. As a church family, we will be working much more deeply on creating a joyous space and meaningful time for our 150th Anniversary celebration in 2018. We have been on a journey since the formation of Trinity Church 150 years ago and we will continue down many other roads in our attempt to follow the will of God. Let us step into the future together, knowing that God is with us on our journey. I share with you an excerpt from Frederick Buechner's *Listening to Your Life*.

The question is not whether the things that happen to you are chance things or God's things because, of course, they are both at once. There is no chance thing through which God cannot speak—even the walk from the house to the garage that you have walked ten thousand times before, even the moments when you cannot believe there is a God who speaks at all anywhere. He speaks, I believe, and the words he speaks are incarnate in the flesh and blood of ourselves and of our own footsore and sacred journeys. We cannot live our lives constantly looking back, listening back, lest we be turned to pillars of longing and regret, but to live without listening at all is to live deaf to the fullness of the music. Sometimes we avoid listening for fear of what we may hear, sometimes for fear that we may hear nothing at all but the empty rattle of our own feet on the pavement. But be not affeard, says Caliban, nor is he the only one to say it. "Be not afraid," says another, "for lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world." He says he is with us on our journeys. He says he has been with us since each of our journeys began. Listen for him. Listen to the sweet and bitter airs of your present and your past for the sound of him.

The Bishop's Bible Challenge

Join Bishop Gutierrez on a year-long journey through the Bible. As a diocesan family this is something we can do together to help us feel connected. It will produce results in our prayer together, in our worship together and most certainly in our study together.

An ideal time to start the Bible Challenge is January 1, when many people make their New Year's Resolutions. Why not make a spiritual resolution and join with our Bishop and others throughout the Diocese and others here at Trinity Church (including your Rector).

Recommended Strategies: We encourage participants in the Bible Challenge to read three chapters of the Old Testament, one psalm and a chapter of the New Testament each day. This will help you read the entire Bible in a year. Reading a chapter of the New Testament and a psalm daily sustains readers through spiritually drier parts of the Hebrew Scriptures. The Diocesan App and the Center for Biblical Studies website (Thecenterforbiblicalstudies.org) offers a schedule of readings for those who want to follow a clear plan of daily Bible reading, which will help you complete your reading in a year's time.

We advocate a devotional approach to reading the Bible as opposed to a purely intellectual or academic approach. We suggest that each reader put him or herself in the presence of God before they start to read. We like the ancient monastic practice of *lectio divina*, where a reader reads the text, meditates on the reading, offers a prayer to God and listens in silence for God to respond. We encourage readers to pause during or after their reading to offer prayers to God.

We encourage participants to skim over long genealogies or dietary codes in order to ensure that you do not get bogged down in tedious sections of the Bible, but continue to read and reach your goal.

If you do not use a computer or smart phone, simply call the Offices of the Diocese at 215-627-6434 and they will register you by phone.

If you need a bible, contact the church office.

A Diocesan App will be released that will have everything you need to read on the go! Once you are registered, you will be notified when the App is available through the App Store.

You may also join the online Facebook group at DIOPA Bishop's Bible Challenge. This is where you can post your own testimonies on the readings in either written or picture response. Check the group page and the hash tags #wordon or #diopabbc to see what other participants are saying!

As a way of providing support and joining together in the challenge, the Bible Study at Trinity on Monday's at 7 p.m. in our social hall, will be devoted to the Bible Challenge!
