From the Rector's Desk

It is September! September means schools are back in session and our vacation season is winding to a close. This means that our Vestry meetings will begin again and our choir will resume with anthems and leading us in singing throughout our worship service. With the return of singing, I thought it appropriate to share another hymn story with you from Robert J. Morgan's book *"Then Sings My Soul"*.

This is the story of the Hallelujah Chorus from The Messiah:

His father tried to discourage his musical interests, preferring that he enter the legal profession. But it was the organ, harpsichord, and violin that captured the heart of young George Frideric Handel. Once, accompanying his father to the court of Duke Johann Adolf, George wandered into the chapel, found the organ, and started improvising. The startled Duke exclaimed, "Who is this remarkable child?"

This "remarkable child" soon began composing operas, first in Italy then in London. By his 20s he was the talk of England and the best paid composer on earth. He opened the Royal Academy of Music. Londoners fought for seats at his every performance, and his fame soared around the world.

But the glory passed. Audiences dwindled. His music became outdated, and he was thought of as an old fogey. Newer artists eclipsed the aging composer. One project after another failed, and Handel, now bankrupt, grew depressed. The stress brought on a case of palsy that crippled some of his fingers. "Handel's great days are over," wrote Frederick the Great, "his inspiration is exhausted."

Yet his troubles also matured him, softening his sharp tongue. His temper mellowed, and his music became more heartfelt. One morning Han-

del received by post a manuscript from Charles Jennens. It was a word-for-word collection of various biblical texts about Christ. The opening words from Isaiah 40 moved Handel: *Comfort ye, comfort ye my people...*

On August 22, 1741 he shut the door of his London home and started composing music for the words. Twenty-three days later, the world had *Messiah*. "Whether I was in the body or out of the body when I wrote it, I know not," Handel later said, trying to describe the experience. *Messiah* opened in London to enormous crowds on March 23, 1743, with Handel leading from his harpsichord. King George II, who was present that night, surprised everyone by leaping to his feet during the Hallelujah Chorus. No one knows why. Some believe the king, being hard of hearing, thought it the national anthem.

No matter—from that day audiences everywhere have stood in reverence during the stirring words: *Hallelujah! For He shall reign forever and ever.*

Handel's fame was rekindled, and even after he lost his eyesight, he continued playing the organ for performances of his oratorios until his death in London, April 14, 1759.



Single Parents Night Out

FLEA MARKET AND CHICKEN BBQ AND JAGUAR, 2016

Thanks to pre-sales of BBQ tickets, we had a successful fundraiser on August 20th. Foot traffic was very thin this year, resulting in poorer than usual sales for the Flea Market and the hotdog and drinks sales. The Women’s Group netted over \$200 for the Flea Market, and the Fundraising Committee recorded less than \$100 in profits for dogs and drinks. We are grateful to all those who bought items, and all those who dedicated many volunteer hours to this endeavor.

The donation to Trinity of a 1998 Jaguar, enabled us to have a successful raffle, adding to the fundraising efforts for building improvements. Thanks to many, many parishioners buying and selling BBQ tickets beforehand, we had the best Chicken Barbeque sale EVER.

When this annual fundraiser first started, it was just the chicken barbeque. After a couple years, the women’s group thought it a good idea to hold their flea market at the same time, to turn the day into a fuller community event. And shortly after, we added the hot dog sales as a means to attract or retain foot traffic and patrons. With maybe a lapse of one or two random years, we have been holding this BBQ for 19+ years. So, these three activities have added funds to our fundraising accounts; but just as important, have allowed Trinity to service the needs of our larger community, and be a visible presence.

We sold 182 chicken dinners; that is an 80% increase over last year!! Adding all efforts together, we netted over \$2600.00. Thank you to all who participated, volunteered, and sold tickets.
