## **Sanctuary Walls**

The insulating and plastering of the walls in our historic sanctuary will be taking place this summer! We are very excited about what some insulation in our walls will do to reduce the yearly costs of heating and air-conditioning. And of course, the aesthetics of the walls when we no longer have large cracks, peeling and chunks of wall falling out (a), will be pleasing. Bear with us during the work period, as we may need to shift where we normally sit and probably have worship in the social hall one or two Sundays this summer.

## The Past Year at Trinity

For the Vestry Retreat on Saturday June 25, 2017, Tom Swett composed a list of some of the significant happenings at Trinity in this past year. See how far we came in one year!

- ❖ We bought and installed a great new organ for \$76,450.00; this is a major commitment to our future in Coatesville.
- ❖ We received a \$15,000.00 grant from the Stewart Huston Charitable Trust for the work of renovating the interior of our historic church sanctuary. Along with numerous donations from our generous members, as of the 2017 Vestry Retreat we have raised a total of \$24,200.00 for the renovations. This allowed the Vestry on Saturday to authorize the letting of contracts so this work can be done in the summer of 2017.
- ❖ Weekly attendance at our Sunday services has increased.
- ❖ When we told Bishop Gutierrez of our proposed project to partner with non-profits in Coatesville, he immediately pledged funding to assist us in grant writing.
- Bishop Gutierrez asked Pastor Sherry to be one of the Rectors to deliver reports on their churches at the Annual Convention of the Diocese of Pennsylvania.
- Plans for our 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebration in 2018 are well underway and making excellent progress; we are on track for a great celebration.
- ❖ Sherry's outreach to the Coatesville community very recently expanded with her agreement to serve on the Board of Community, Youth and Women's Alliance, Inc. (CYWA, just down the street from our church). Sherry continues to serve as a Chaplain to the Coatesville Police Department, and to lead the successful "What's Cookin' in Coatesville" community meal program at our church.
- ❖ We celebrated the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the integration of the congregations of St. Cyril's Church and Church of the Trinity, which occurred in 1967. We were honored by the presence and blessings of the former Presiding Bishop of the Episcopal Church of the United States, The Rt. Rev. Frank Griswold. We also dedicated our new Organ and our newly-renovated St. Cyril's Chapel; the renovations were done by the Evans family.
- ❖ We are actively involved in the Second Century Alliance, the group steering the redevelopment efforts in Coatesville.

- We moved the fencing on the Third Avenue side of the Coatesville Community Garden, next to our church, to help facilitate the Third Avenue Streetscapes Project (scheduled to begin this year).
- Many, if not all, of the above happenings have caused the Episcopal Church of the Trinity to be recognized as a positive force in the city of Coatesville.

#### TRINITY COLUMBARIUM

Exciting things are happening at Trinity these days, not the least of which is the ongoing progress being made in preparation for the long awaited columbarium. Bill Terry and I have been quietly researching suppliers, contractors, designs, costs, etc, and now it's time to bring the Trinity congregation into the equation.

At the Annual Meeting in March, we first presented the concept of the columbarium, its function and the benefits as a final resting place of perpetual peace. The columbarium is designed to provide a modern alternative to the cemetery. Simply put, it is a collection of niches designed to house and protect the cremated remains of the deceased. Each niche is inscribed with the name and dates of birth and death of the departed within, and will have the capacity to house two urns. The columbarium will be part of Trinity Episcopal Church and will fall under the purview of sitting Vestry. A Columbarium Committee, approved by Vestry, would oversee operation and maintenance of the columbarium, to include perpetual care.

The cost of a niche historically includes the opening and closing for inurnment, plaque inscription and perpetual care. Related services offered by a funeral home, such as cremation and the urn, are not included. Current and trending costs for a traditional funeral and cemetery plot, etc. (\$8,000 minimum), immediately suggest the practicality of a columbarium.

Now, this is where the members of our congregation come in...we are considering several designs and sizes of columbaria. But a very large part of the final decision is predicated on advance or intended sales of niches, allowing us to move forward towards completion before the end of calendar year 2018. Niches will also be made available to non-Trinity members, as well as through local funeral homes with whom we will publicize the availability of the columbarium to their clients.

That said, it is the wish of the Committee and Vestry to afford the Trinity family the opportunity to purchase a niche(s) at a favored reduced pre-construction cost or at an ongoing cost at time of need as shown.....

<u>Members</u>: Pre-Construction - \$800.00 Ongoing at Time of Need - \$1,000.00

Non-Members: Pre-Construction - \$1,200.00 Ongoing at Time of Need - \$1,500.00

We will be distributing a questionnaire in the coming weeks for members to indicate whether they wish to purchase a niche prior to completion of construction or reserve their place now and arrange for payment at time of need. These will be treated in confidentiality and available only to Rev. Sherry, Bill Terry or myself. Our church ministers to the spiritual needs of many from baptism through life and now, via the columbarium, ultimately in death. Please take the time now to consider remaining close to Trinity even as you celebrate new life.
