From the Rector's Desk . . .

The summer was a full one at Trinity Church! There is much news to share about our building. We are very happy to have the completion of the main entrance door by Stone Hall (at long last) with a new key card entry system. Instructions on disarming and arming the burglar alarm system will be forthcoming for all who need keys to enter during off hours. The insulating of the walls of our beloved Sanctuary is complete. The removal of the old and installation of the new plaster in the Sanctuary is complete and we discovered a slate roof leak (actually the plasterers did) that we were able to have repaired along with having our entire slate roof inspected. A total of 21 slates were replaced and our gutters were cleared. We also had a sewer main backup in our building and the end of August that came through the library bathroom toilet. The clog was cleared and the soiled carpet in the library has been removed, the floors sanitized. The library is only temporarily out of operation until we resolve new flooring and put the library shelves back together again.

It seems amazing that we continue to plug away at bringing our old and historic buildings into better condition. We are certainly getting closer and closer to finishing major repairs and renovations. This is good news, very good news, and I am grateful for the generosity that has been expressed by our beloved members and also by non-members! I share from the little book *Thoughts to Make Your Heart Sing* by Sally Lloyd-Jones & Jago the piece entitled Staircase for Boats:

"When a riverboat needs to go up a hill, it navigates through a lock (which is basically a staircase for boats). The boat enters a sealed chamber. Gradually, the water level is raised, lifting the boat up, until the water inside is at the same level as the river ahead. The gates open and the boat continues on. But from the boat entering the lock—you can't see the river ahead. It looks like a dead end! And the Bible says we can't see everything God is doing in our lives either. But what looks like a dead end is really God lifting you up. Because there are no dead ends with God. Only new beginnings in disguise".
