Our menu items were: scrambled eggs, bacon, baked French toast, baked ham, roasted chicken in gravy, garlic mashed potatoes, corn pudding, sweet potato casserole, collard greens, cole slaw, macaroni and potato salads, pineapple bread pudding, fresh baked biscuits, *world famous* deviled eggs by Joe Kirkner, fresh fruit, desserts, water, juice and coffee.

Before grace was given by Brother John our upcoming newlyweds, Lisa & Eric, were asked to light the candle on the Missing Man Table.

On behalf of Trinity Brunch Bunch, I would like to extend my sincerest thanks to everyone that continues to come out every month and support this wonderful outreach. LAUNDRY LOVE

Episcopal Church of the Trinity, Coatesville is beginning a cooperative project with Episcopal Church of the Good Samaritan, Paoli, to benefit Coatesville residents. This project, called "Laundry Love," will benefit low income/no income families of Coatesville. It began as an Episcopal Church program, but other denominations across the country like it too. What will members of both churches be asked to do? Donate money to feed the machines, donate jars of detergent pods, dryer sheets, one-gallon plastic Ziploc bags for the supplies and quarters and 13-gallon new trash bags for clean, folded laundry. More important: donate four hours of your time, 4pm – 8pm, to be a Laundry Love "attendant": hand out the laundry supplies and quarters (\$5 worth), meet and talk to the adults doing the laundry (good time to tell your story and tell them how loving our church is), and read storybooks to the children to give their parents a break. We are initially going to one laundromat, once per month, and we're sharing this work of love with Good Samaritan members.

Benefits to the families receiving the supplies and conversation: meeting wonderful, compassionate YOU! Receiving help with an ongoing expense that really adds up for these families. Helping kids and families feel better about themselves because they have clean clothes (really, this is a "thing" – kids feel ashamed in school when they have dirty and smelly clothes). Experiencing God's love as embodied by you.

Benefits to you: getting out beyond the walls of our beloved Trinity and loving our neighbors as ourselves. Meeting people where they are in life and helping them.

What to do next: bring in rolls or envelopes of quarters, or bills, and use pre-marked envelopes which will be provided at the back of the church. If you want to give a check, put "Laundry Love" on the memo line. Place the money donations in the collection plate. Bring in jars of detergent pods, boxes of dryer sheets, boxes of one-gallon Ziploc bags, or boxes of 13-gallon white tie-up plastic garbage bags and place them in a designated box at the back of the church.
