THE NICENE CREED



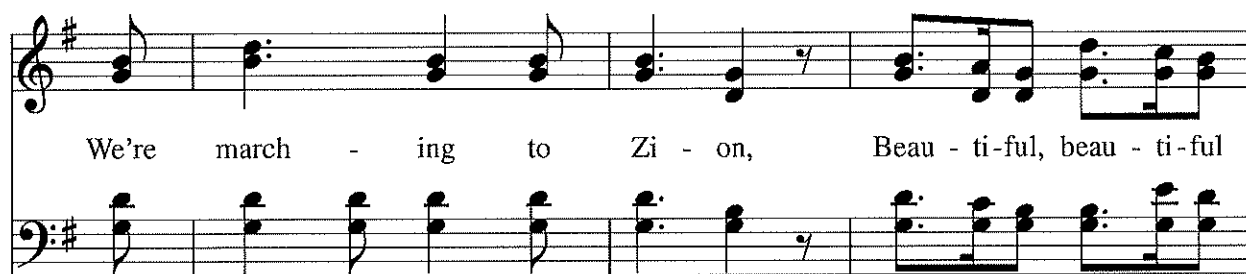

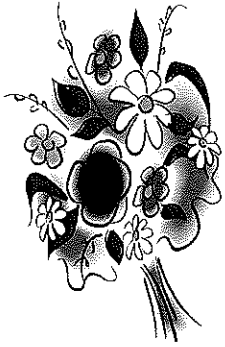
