From the Rector's Desk . . .

Dear Friends,

We had a very good Vestry retreat in June, starting off with a reflection on the parable of the sower from Matthew's gospel. "What are the seeds that you are planting in your life – joy, optimism, confusion, doubt? In what type of soil have you chosen to, or by default, planted them? What implications does this have for ministry leaders?" What seeds are you sowing in your life?

The Trinity community has been deprived of the nurture of in person communication and fellowship, something that has been so meaningful to us – the energy that exists when we are physically present with each other; the feel of the sacred space of our sanctuary. We have walked through a difficult season in our lives and as the pandemic is coming under control with vaccination rates, we are entering into a liminal space, an in-between space. The uncomfortable space between what has been and what will be. But, we simply do not know exactly 'what will be' looks like. We don't know what to expect. An example I've heard from two other people is that of getting in a boat to cross from one shore to another. We are in the middle of the water and have lost sight of the shore we left and still have not seen the shore we are moving toward. But we are moving toward the land and solid ground.

As we continue coming together physically, we can and we will navigate this liminal space to the best of our abilities. There are often no "right" answers in this space, so let's continue to be gentle with each other as we find our way. It will take time to process the many and varied thoughts and feelings experienced in this last year and a half. Understanding that, we will incorporate some time in our July 11 service to recognize the losses we have experienced in the pandemic. (i.e. Loss of lives – family and friends; job losses/changes; trips that never happened; etc.) Many experienced feelings of anger, fear and frustration because of a difficult political environment and racial tensions. Let's acknowledge that, pray together, light candles, possibly bring something meaningful to the service to place at a designated spot that might represent what was lost, what you might need to let go of, what you might now be making a priority in your life, etc., etc. Let's come together and "mark" this liminal time. It will be a time for lament and movement into the hope and abundant life we know as we live in to Christ's love and call on our lives. There have been blessings even the midst of the chaos.

I have deeply missed your faces and the energy of your presence in Trinity's Sanctuary and social hall over this last year and a half. Let us safely begin re-gathering as the family style

Healing Service via Zoom Thursdays at Noon

We continue to offer a Healing Service via Zoom on Thursdays at Noon. The Zoom link is emailed via our Constant Contact email service on Wednesdays along with a copy of the order of service for the week. The order of service is also shared on the screen during the service itself. We commemorate a "saint" from the Episcopal Church utilizing the resource 'A Great Cloud of Witnesses' and share a little healing music from a variety of sources.

Beginning in September, we plan to resume our in person Healing Service on Thursdays at Noon in St. Cyril's Chapel.

Family Service at 11:15 a.m. Sunday, July 4 In person and live-streamed

As you may be aware, Trinity has been taking advantage of technology and trying something a little different. We have a small group that is willing to experiment with a different style of worship, which is primarily about experiencing a different style of music. We have received positive feedback, and we are now making some adjustments. The service will take place at 11:15 a.m. (instead of 4:30) on the First Sunday of each month and we are naming it our Family Service. The Vestry is supportive of moving forward boldly and our plan is to have a 'praise band' with keyboard, guitar and drums. We will have additional musicians and vocals! We have had to purchase an additional music license to cover the music and will be receiving advice on a new keyboard and drum set. If anyone is interested in contributing financially toward this new, important worship ministry, please feel to do so! We are sowing seeds that we hope will grow into additional members of our Trinity community.

Like our regular Sunday worship service, the service is in person and also live-streamed and the videos will find a home on our Trinity Facebook page and YouTube channel for you to check out later. This is one way we are seeking to reach new people who may prefer a different style of music. Look for this to happen on the first Sunday of each month. Check it out! Let your friends know!

Special Service of Lament and Hope Sunday, July 11th at 9:30 a.m.

This service will include some time to recognize the various losses—family, friends and other types of losses—we have experienced during this long pandemic. Let us know of people who have passed away that you would like to have named during this special service. In many cases, we have not processed all that has happened to us and around us in the last year and a half (death, job losses, political tensions, racial tensions, etc.) because we have been deprived of the nurture of in-person community and weekly communion. There will also be an area set aside for lighting candle(s) and perhaps bring something meaningful from home to place at this space which represents what has ended, what we need to let go, what we have lost. This is a service to reflect the need to lament with the hope of celebration.

Morning Prayer with Music Sunday, July 18th at 9:30 a.m.

Pastor Sherry will be on vacation July 12 - 19 and again on August $9 - 16^{th}$. This is an opportunity for you to experience Morning Prayer, a traditional part of the Episcopal worship experience. Many practice Morning Prayer and Evening Prayer on a daily basis and the services can be found in our Book of Common Prayer. Deacon Joan will lead us on Sunday, July 18^{th} and Sunda, August 15^{th} .

Trinity Re-Gathering Celebration Sunday, September 12 Worship and Fellowship

The first Sunday after Labor Day has traditionally been known as Rally Day at Trinity. This year we are planning a grand "Re-Gathering" celebration. The Bentleys have graciously offered their beautiful property as the setting for an outdoor worship service and picnic afterwards. (In the event of rain, there is an arena we can use). Place the date on your calendar – fellowship activities and opportunities for FUN are in the works!
