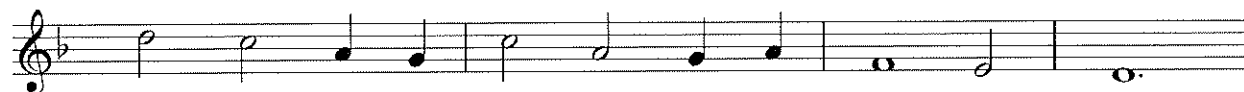

THE SERMON BY DEACON JOAN WYLIE

THE NICENE CREED

All stand.

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.
