

THE CREED





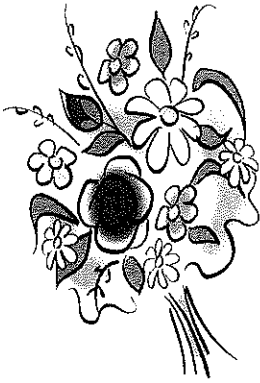
