





#### GOSPEL: Luke 15:1-3, 11b-32

All stand.

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

People

Glory to you, Lord Christ.

Now all the tax collectors and sinners were coming near to listen to him. <sup>2</sup>And the Pharisees and the scribes were grumbling and saying, "This fellow welcomes sinners and eats with them."

<sup>3</sup>So he told them this parable: <sup>11b4</sup>There was a man who had two sons. <sup>12</sup>The younger of them said to his father, 'Father, give me the share of the property that will belong to me.' So he divided his property between them. <sup>13</sup>A few days later the younger son gathered all he had and traveled to a distant country, and there he squandered his property in dissolute living. <sup>14</sup>When he had spent everything, a severe famine took place throughout that country, and he began to be in need. <sup>15</sup>So he went and hired himself out to one of the citizens of that country, who sent him to his fields to feed the pigs. <sup>16</sup>He would gladly have filled himself with the pods that the pigs were eating; and no one gave him anything. <sup>17</sup>But when he came to himself he said, 'How many of my

father's hired hands have bread enough and to spare, but here I am dying of hunger! <sup>18</sup>I will get up and go to my father, and I will say to him, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you; <sup>19</sup>I am no longer worthy to be called your son; treat me like one of your hired hands." <sup>20</sup>So he set off and went to his father. But while he was still far off, his father saw him and was filled with compassion; he ran and put his arms around him and kissed him. <sup>21</sup>Then the son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you; I am no longer worthy to be called your son.' <sup>22</sup>But the father said to his slaves, 'Quickly, bring out a robe—the best one—and put it on him; put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. <sup>23</sup>And get the fatted calf and kill it, and let us eat and celebrate; <sup>24</sup>for this son of mine was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found!' And they began to celebrate.

<sup>25</sup>"Now his elder son was in the field; and when he came and approached the house, he heard music and dancing. <sup>26</sup>He called one of the slaves and asked what was going on. <sup>27</sup>He replied, 'Your brother has come, and your father has killed the fatted calf, because he has got him back safe and sound.' <sup>28</sup>Then he became angry and refused to go in. His father came out and began to plead with him. <sup>29</sup>But he answered his father, 'Listen! For all these years I have been working like a slave for you, and I have never disobeyed your command; yet you have never given me even a young goat so that I might celebrate with my friends. <sup>30</sup>But when this son of yours came back, who has devoured your property with prostitutes, you killed the fatted calf for him!' <sup>31</sup>Then the father said to him, 'Son, you are always with me, and all that is mine is yours. <sup>32</sup>But we had to celebrate and rejoice, because this brother of yours was dead and has come to life; he was lost and has been found.'"

## THE SERMON BY THE REV. SHERRY DEETS

#### THE NICENE CREED







## A Lenten Practice for This Week - 3/27 to 4/2

As a Lenten prayer practice this week, consider praying for all those people in Poland, Romania, Moldova, Hungary and Slovakia who are helping Ukrainian refugees fleeing their country by train, car, and even on foot, carrying children, carrying suitcases or bundles.

The people from these nations are feeding the refugees, finding shelter for them, and processing them in some cases to continue onward. The most moving photo I've seen was of a train station platform in Poland with a line of strollers left by Polish families for Ukrainian mothers to use upon arrival.

Try sitting quietly for a few minutes, and find what your heart feels you would like to do if you could be there to help the refugees. Would you be walking up and down with a crying baby for a tired mother? Would you be cooking to feed them? Would you be putting an arm around someone's shoulders? Would you be taking a turn for someone already helping so that person could get some rest?

Bless all those who are helping in these countries.

A prayer you might wish to pray:

Gracious God, strengthen and sustain all those who volunteer with refugees; that with patience and understanding they may love and care for your people; and grant that together they may follow Jesus Christ, offering to you their gifts and talents; through him who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

## And then, Part 2:

World Central Kitchen, web address <a href="https://wck.org">https://wck.org</a>, was founded in 2010 right after the devastating earthquake in Haiti. Chef José Andrés and his non-profit organization's staff and volunteers have found ways to rapidly bring field kitchens and food into disaster areas to begin cooking and feeding people. They cook locally familiar foods. In areas that do have kitchens and restaurants, they cooperatively use them and pay the staff to cook and package up meals.

In 55 cities, both in Ukraine and in surrounding countries, over one million meals have been served. And it's not one location per city – there are over 330 distribution points for the meals.
