



The Lessons

FIRST READING: Deuteronomy 26:1-11

The people sit.

A Reading from the book of Deuteronomy.

¹When you have come into the land that the LORD your God is giving you as an inheritance to possess, and you possess it, and settle in it, ²you shall take some of the first of all the fruit of the ground, which you harvest from the land that the LORD your God is giving you, and you shall put it in a basket and go to the place that the LORD your God will choose as a dwelling for his name. ³You shall go to the priest who is in office at that time, and say to him, "Today I declare to the LORD your God that I have come into the land that the LORD swore to our ancestors to give us." ⁴When the priest takes the basket from your hand and sets it down before the altar of the LORD your God, ⁵you shall make this response before the LORD your God: "A wandering Aramean was my ancestor; he went down into Egypt and lived there as an alien, few in number, and there he became a great nation, mighty and populous. ⁶When the Egyptians treated us harshly and afflicted us, by imposing hard labor on us, ⁷we cried to the LORD, the God of our ancestors; the LORD heard our voice and saw our affliction, our toil, and our oppression. ⁸The LORD brought us out of Egypt with a mighty hand and an outstretched arm, with a

terrifying display of power, and with signs and wonders; ⁹and he brought us into this place and gave us this land, a land flowing with milk and honey. ¹⁰So now I bring the first of the fruit of the ground that you, O LORD, have given me." THE NICENE CREED

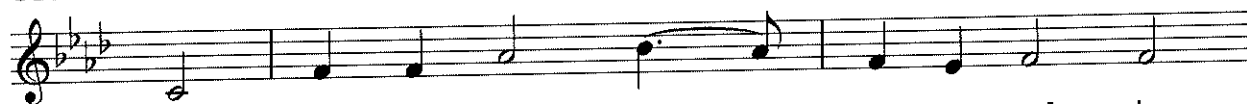

A Lenten Practice for This Week

Lent has been a season for many people of "giving up" something they love, whether candy or Facebook or something else. For some of us, this happened because our parents and Sunday School teachers tried to teach us about this thoughtful and penitential season in a way we children could understand – no candy!

Other people take on an additional spiritual discipline, and that is what I'm suggesting. Daily this week (and for as long beyond this week as you feel moved to do this) pray for the people of Ukraine; include the Russian soldiers too.

One prayer you might like to use is the following. Remember, however, that your own words or thoughts of prayer are heard by God just as much as the beautifully composed prayer of two Archbishops in the Anglican church.

"God of peace and justice,
we pray for the people of Ukraine today.
We pray for peace and the laying down of weapons.
We pray for all those who fear for tomorrow,
that your Spirit of comfort would draw near to them.
We pray for those with power over war or peace,
for wisdom, discernment and compassion to guide their decisions.
Above all, we pray for all your precious children, at risk and in fear,
that you would hold and protect them.
We pray in the name of Jesus, the Prince of Peace.
Amen"
