





I consider it a blessing to have been asked to serve Trinity as its senior warden. My role, serving at the pleasure of the rector, is to be a support person for her. Looking back on 2022, we have so many things to be thankful for. We have fully reopened and gotten back to many of the in-person activities we enjoyed in the past. Among my favorites are Breakfast with Santa and our second annual Rally Day event at the Bentley property.

Last year, we added to our staff with our first Community Coordinator, Liz Hulse. Liz has been doing an excellent job of outreach to our neighbors in Coatesville, helping our community mission by making connections between Trinity and other organizations in the city. One early success was us providing Christmas gift bags for our neighbors at Coatesville Towers.

In November, we reformatted the monthly family service into a quarterly youth service. At our first one, we had several talented young musicians playing saxophone, trombone, euphonium, and violin for us. The highlight is surely the performances from our youngest members, though, under Donna Fleck's guidance. Nothing makes me smile more than hearing young voices in church!

We've welcomed new members and lost some longtime members. Such is the cycle of life in a living congregation, but I treasure every new relationship as well as every memory I have of friends who have moved away or have passed on. One longtime friend whom we'll miss this year is Deacon Joan Wylie, who is now enjoying a well-deserved retirement from many years of serving Trinity as our deacon.

We are fortunate to have the opportunity to livestream our services on Facebook every Sunday, bringing Trinity's worship and Sherry's inspired weekly message to friends who are unable to leave home, or who have moved out of the local area. For members who don't live too far away and are able to come in person from time to time, we would love to welcome you inside the red doors and join you in fellowship.

None of us knows what is in store for Trinity in 2023 – but one thing I'm confident of is that we will have another thriving year serving Jesus and the people of Coatesville, having fun and loving one another as we do it. Thank you all for sharing your spiritual journeys with me.

TRINITY ANNUAL MEETING 2023 TREASURER'S REPORT

Trinity had another sound financial year in 2022. The operating fund ended the year with a net gain of \$11,210. The factors contributing to this gain were a very robust use of Stone Hall, higher than budgeted investment income, and lower than budgeted deacon and community

coordinator expenses.

The building improvement fund got a big infusion of funds in 2022 as a result of a large insurance payment to reimburse Trinity for Hurricane Ida damage. Much of that money is unspent as we collect bids and assess priorities. We also received two sizable grants from the Stewart Huston Trust. Reverend Sherry deserves the majority of the credit for all the above. Trinity did not have any major building projects in 2022 but did repair the stucco around the columbarium, begin waterproofing the basement and incur a few other minor expenses.

Trinity investments in the Church Foundation Mutual Fund took a hit in 2022 as the stock market descended. But the church has enough liquid investments to weather this type of fluctuation. As interest rates rise, we hope to be able to once again earn some income on our liquid

investments.

Thanks to generous pledging for 2023, we produced a balanced budget. Please take the time to look over the budgets and statements that follow. Let me know if you have any questions now or at any point during the year.

Sunday, March 19, 2023

2022 saw the VA Medical Center still under restrictions for attending off-campus events. So the February, March, April and May brunches were prepared as takeout meals and delivered to the VA. We averaged 60 meals per month.

Our dedicated volunteers prepared and packaged and delivered hearty meals by 12:30 pm on the last Sunday of each of these months. The love and concern of everyone was evident and displayed each month with enthusiastic efforts.

In July, we had a cookout at Trinity!! A return to inhouse brunches; yay. But only 12 veterans were able to attend. The remaining months of 2022 saw our need to repeatedly cancel the monthly brunch.

In January 2023 we completed our last takeout meal to 55 veterans. This outreach program has now been suspended until further review. Many questions need to be asked and answered by Trinity members....how can we better honor our veterans? Do we need to refocus our outreach to other community groups? We are a small congregation, but the efforts we contribute are enormous; where should we direct our energies and love?
