Dear Friends,

This June I share from Joyce Rupp's book, *The Cup of our Life: A Guide for Spiritual Growth*, about Learning Compassion:

I learned a lot about compassion from one of my college professors. I remember how surprised I was when she took a personal interest in me, a homesick freshman. I observed her care and concern for each of the students in her large classes. She would take time to stop a student in class or on campus, ask how he or she was, and then, really listen to the response. I remember nothing of what she taught me in that class, but I remember everything of how she was with me and with the other students.


Compassionate people often inspire others to be compassionate. I feel this way whenever I meditate on the life of Jesus. I marvel at how Jesus was so consistently compassionate when he met the ill, the grieving, the hungry, the oppressed. He is often described as being "deeply moved in spirit" or feeling compassion for the people. Jesus touched torn and tattered people with an amazing awareness of their woundedness. The vastness of his ability to love and be loved is phenomenal.

I've also been inspired by compassionate people in history such as Dorothy Day, Mahatma Ghandi, Etty Hillisum, Tom Dooley, Mother Teresa, and Albert Schwietzer. I was in awe as I read about the English spiritual writer, Caryll Houselander. Psychologists would bring their mentally and emotionally ill patients whom they could not cure to live
