This October sharing is from Joyce Rupp's book *May I Have This Dance?*: An invitation to faithful prayer throughout the year.

Instruments of God

A small, wooden flute, an empty hollow reed, rests in her silent hand. It awaits the breath of one who creates song through its open form. My often-empty life rests in the hand of God: like the hollowed flute, it yearns for the melody which only Breath can give. The small, wooden flute and I, we need the one who breathes, we await one who makes melody: and the one whose touch creates, awaits our empty, ordinary forms, so that the song-starved world may be fed with golden melodies --Joyce Rupp

I cannot make the melody of God happen by myself. Just as a flute needs someone's breath in order to have musical life, so too, I

need God to breathe a melody of goodness through me as I go about my busy days. I must be receptive if God's song is to be sung through me.

Imagine how differently we might live our lives if, each day when we awakened, we envisioned ourselves as an instrument of God. We would know each day that we were not alone. We would draw comfort and joy from the divine musician making a melody of goodness with our gifts and talents.

We would know that God's understanding and compassion were being sung through us when we were with people who were sick or troubled. In our place of work, we would sense Divine guidance and wisdom begin played through our tasks. In the grocery store, we would be aware of God's quieting presence playing a song of harmony amid the rush of shoppers. At lunch, we would hear the song of God's companionship. We would remember to be the music of God's patience in trying to discipline unruly children. When listening to the painful story of someone with many struggles, we would find God's kindness being played through our own listening hearts.

During the month of October, you are invited to be an instrument of God's goodness. Develop your awareness each day of how God makes music through you. Discover anew how Divine love touches others' lives because of your availability and openness to the divine musician's presence. Enjoy the song that God plays through you.

Reflect upon your life as an instrument of God. What kind of instrument would you be? A flute, a piano, a drum, a violin, a clarinet? What draws you to see yourself in this way? What kind of music is God playing in your life now? A golden oldie, a spirited march, a dissonant piece, a dirge, a lullaby, a rock song, a ballad? What song title sums up the way God has been a part of your life? At the end of each day, pause and reflect on the kind of music that played through your life. You may want to record this so you can have an overview at the end of the month. You may see a significant pattern in the music that you hear.

- 2. Bring your favorite Bible. "A Bible, preferably one that includes the Apocrypha."
- "The New Oxford Annotated Bible: New Revised Standard Version with the Apocrypha" is recommended. A Paperback copy of the recommended Bible can be purchased from Amazon.com for \$39.49, or an online version for Kindle for \$9.90.

Synopsis: Here is the synopsis of the text and study:

"The Scriptures are an essential aspect of the Christian faith. But we have often equated them with the living Word Himself, even elevating them above the One to whom they point. In doing so, we have distorted their central message and our view of God. Tragically, this has caused multitudes of people unnecessary doubt, confusion, and pain in their encounters with the Scriptures... Your journey on the Emmaus Way will open up to you the fullness of the Scriptures, and, most important, lead you to the God who deeply loves and welcomes you."
